III. SECTION 30. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

A. Building Inspection:

1. Fees charged for building permits are set forth in the latest edition of the Uniform Administrative Code fee schedule unamended, except as amended in paragraph 2 below. Refunds for permits issued will be limited to 80% of the permit costs, not later than 180 days after the date of fee payment. No refunds for plan review costs will be given if the plan review has been conducted. A one-hour minimum fee will be charged on all building permits.
2. Every building permit fee will be subject to a 1% surcharge levied by the State of Utah. However, when no fee is charged, no state surcharge is levied.
3. Resident building permit fee waiver. Building permit fees will be waived for permits associated with improvements or rehabilitation of city resident owner-occupied single-family dwellings, and construction of accessory buildings which are accessory to resident owner single-family dwellings. This fee waiver does not abrogate the need to obtain the required permit.

B. Building Department:

1. Administrative fee for failure to acquire a building permit will be two times (2x) the calculated building permit fee.

2. Plan Review Deposit: Deposits shall be applied to the cost of the issuance of the permit provided that the building permit is issued within twelve (12) months after submission of plans to be checked. If the building permit is not issued within 12 months, the deposit shall be forfeited.

G. License Period: All licenses shall be issued and fee charged for a license period of one year. All licenses applied for after 6 months of the license period has elapsed, shall be charged ½ the annual fee. All fees are non-refundable.

H. Penalty: There shall be assessed a penalty in the amount of 100% of the license fee if a business begins doing business without first having obtained a license. If any person shall neglect, fail or refuse to pay the amount assessed when it becomes due on any license, for a period of 30 days after the due date, a penalty of 50% shall be added to the original amount. Any license fee which is delinquent after 60 days, shall be assessed a penalty of 100% (double fee). Any business delinquent after 90 days shall be deemed to be

doing business without a license and subject to any and all fee penalties and other actions. If the City is required to initiate legal proceedings to enjoin a business from engaging in business without a license, an additional penalty of \$500 will be assessed.

B. Any fee added to this fee schedule shall be effective as specified by the enacting ordinance or resolution. The Consolidated Fee Schedule shall thereafter be amended by the City Council as soon as possible to include the new fee(s).

XIV. SECTION 120. OTHER FEES

A. This Consolidated Fee Schedule does not repeal, abrogate, annul, or in any way impair or interfere with existing provisions of other resolutions, ordinances, or laws, except to effect modification of the fees reflected above. The fees listed in the Consolidated Fee Schedule supersede present fees for the services specified, but all fees not listed remain in effect. Where this Schedule imposes a higher fee than is imposed or required by existing provisions of resolutions, ordinances, or laws, the provisions of this Schedule shall control.
